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PARADISO SEAFOOD AND GRILLE REOPENS AT ROYAL HAWAIIAN SHOPPING CENTER

Newly Renovated Restaurant Promises Mouth-Watering Menu

Waikīkī – Royal Hawaiian Shopping Center is proud to announce the grand re-opening of long time eatery, Paradiso Seafood and Grille. Known for its island-fresh menu, Paradiso recently opened for business in July in its new 3,500-square-foot home. Paradiso Seafood and Grille, located on the first level of Building B just next to The Royal Grove, features an international cuisine that lobster, calamari and steak lovers alike will enjoy.

“Paradiso Seafood and Grille has been a part of Royal Hawaiian Shopping Center since 1990 and for 17 years it has been a fantastic dining option and a true delight for our guests,” said Marleen Akau, general manager for the Center. “It continues to be an outstanding partner as we revitalize the Center.”

The new location can fit up to 120 people and features Hawai’i-inspired interior design. Mahogany-stained bamboo shoots drape across the ceiling in parallel lines for a hale-like ambience. The amber walls give a warm glow, reflecting the outdoor lānai that offers open-air seating next to the lush Royal Grove and its peaceful ethnobotanical gardens. Paradiso also features a semi-private room with shoji fusion wooden panels that separate it from the rest of the restaurant. The room can be reserved for private parties and accommodates up to 40 guests.

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Paradiso Seafood & Grille is open seven days a week. Lunch is served from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. and dinner is served from 5 to 10 p.m. Pau hana patrons can enjoy cocktails in the lounge from 3 to 5 p.m. Lunch and dinner menus offer many of the same delectable dishes such as the Spanish Style Risotto (“ala Paella”). The lunch menu offers plate lunches such as Garlic Chicken and Ahi Crispy, while the dinner menu offers a more extensive appetizer list. The dinner menu also offers more entrées from the grill such as the Seafood Brochette or the Original Salad Niçoise. Lunch prices range from \$4.75 for the soup of the day to \$24.50 for a one-and-a-quarter-pound live Maine lobster. Dinner prices vary between \$5.50 for the soup of the day to \$31.95 for a 14-ounce prime New York steak.

Royal Hawaiian Shopping Center, the premier shopping destination in Waikīkī, consists of more than 310,000 square feet along a three-block stretch of Waikīkī’s famed Kalākaua Avenue. The unique four-level Center is undergoing a major multi-million dollar renovation that will transform the dynamics of Waikīkī by offering visitors and kama’āina the largest public gathering space for entertainment and culture. The makeover will restore a Hawaiian sense of place to the physical and operational environments of the Center to host a dynamic mix of 110 world-class retailers, dining and entertainment venues. Completion is slated for first quarter 2008. The Center is situated on more than six acres of prime real estate in Waikīkī and is owned by Kamehameha Schools.
